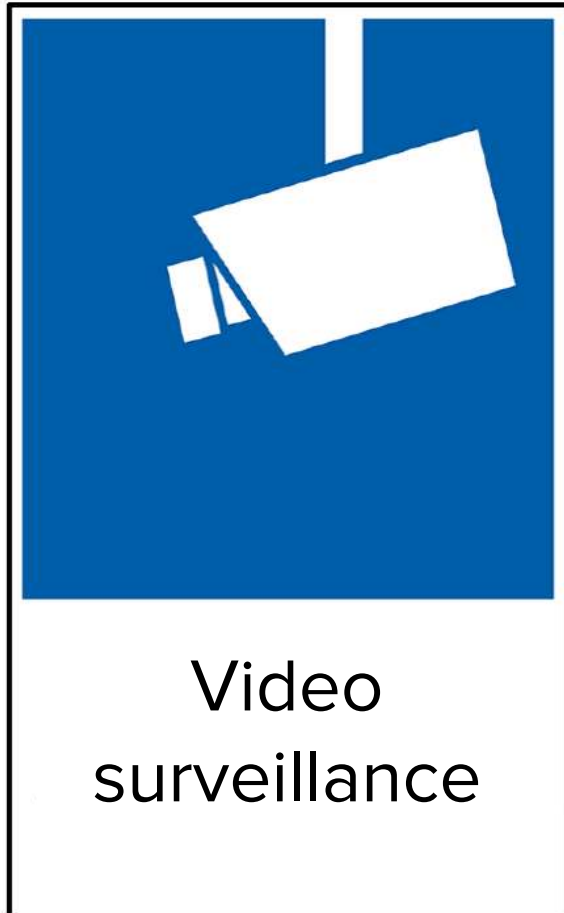

Purposes and legal basis of data processing:

Building protection Art. 6 Abs. 1 lit. f) DS-GVO i. V. m.
§4 Abs. 1 Nr. 2 Bundesdatenschutzgesetz

legitimate interests that are being pursued:

Safeguarding of domestic law, investigation and
prevention of criminal offences

Storage duration The personal data collected via
video recording will be deleted immediately without
knowledge of the recorded images, provided that no
incident is detected. This period begins with the
review of any incidents by a responsible person, at
the latest after 72 hours.

**Recipients or categories of recipients of the data**

Only the persons and bodies responsible for operating the video cameras are granted access to the video recordings. Video surveillance is only passed on to the police, public prosecutor's office or courts for evidentiary purposes. The evidence-protecting images are taken from the recording and transferred to a new data medium. This medium is encrypted according to the state of the art and made available to the above-mentioned law enforcement agencies.

Information on the rights of the data subjects

The data subject has the right to obtain confirmation from the controller as to whether personal data concerning him or her are being processed; if this is the case, he or she has a right of access to such personal data and to the information specified in Article 15 of the GDPR.

The data subject has the right to obtain from the controller the rectification without undue delay of inaccurate personal data concerning him or her and, where applicable, the completion of incomplete personal data (Art. 16 GDPR).

The data subject has the right to request the controller to erase personal data concerning him or her without undue delay if one of the reasons listed in detail in Art. 17 GDPR applies, e.g. if the data is no longer needed for the purposes pursued (right to erasure).

The data subject has the right to request the controller to restrict processing if one of the conditions listed in Art. 18 GDPR applies, e.g. if the data subject has objected to the processing, for the duration of the controller's review.

The data subject has the right to object at any time, on grounds relating to his or her particular situation, to the processing of personal data concerning him or her. The controller shall then no longer process the personal data unless it can demonstrate compelling legitimate grounds for the processing which override the interests, rights and freedoms of the data subject, or for the establishment, exercise or defense of legal claims (Article 21 GDPR).



Without prejudice to any other administrative or judicial remedy, any data subject shall have the right to lodge a complaint with a supervisory authority if the data subject considers that the processing of personal data concerning him or her infringes the GDPR (Art. 77 GDPR). The data subject may exercise this right before a supervisory authority in the Member State of his or her residence, place of work or the place of the alleged infringement.
